Public Safety Report April 2019

Statistical Highlights

During the month of April, there were four reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with five for the month of March and eight during the month of April last year. Officers made nine in-custody or field release arrest in April for DWI-Open Container, Possession of Controlled Substance, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Theft, Possession of Criminal Instrument, and Minor in Possession of Alcohol.

Officers responded to 21 Traffic Crashes, compared to 16 for March, and this resulted in ten crash reports being created. Six crashes this month occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In April, our officers made 348 traffic stops, resulting in 244 violations (70%), and 269 warnings (77%). Of the violations that were cited, 144 (41%) were for speeding, including 53 for speeding in a school zone. Officers also wrote three citations for failing to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 40 violations and 69 warnings.

During April, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 206, calls for service, compared to 195 calls for service in March. During the month, 39 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 61 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 73 for March.

Investigations

In March, Detective Torres was assigned 11 new cases. Detective Torres currently has 36 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 36 hours of training, including classes in "Common Threats", "Social Engineering" and "Security Awareness".
