Public Safety Report June, 2017

Investigations

In June, Detective Torres was assigned 19 new cases. 18 of these cases were closed or suspended in June and one is carrying over into July. Detective Torres currently has 10 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 159 hours of training, including classes in "Autism and Asperger's Awareness", "Crisis Intervention Training", "Taser Update", "Search Warrants, Brady, and Morton", "Exterior Response to Active Shooter Events" and numerous "Computer Spam/Spoofing" awareness classes.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of June, there were eight reported Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) part 1 offenses, compared with five for the month of May and four during the month of June last year. Officers made six arrests during the month – one for an Open Container in a vehicle, three for Public Intoxication, and two for Driving while License Invalid.

Officers responded to 53 Traffic Collisions, compared to 33 for April, and this resulted in 11 crash reports being created. Our most common collision location this month requiring a police report was the 3500-3600 block of Bee Cave Road.

In June, our officers made 189 traffic stops, issuing 143 citations (75.6%) resulting in 151 violations, and 77 warnings (40.7%). Of the violations that were cited, 99 (65.6%) were for speeding. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 31 violations and 21 warnings.

During June, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 317 calls for service compared to 313 for May. This resulted in 41 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 238 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 107 for May.
