Public Safety Report February, 2017

Investigations

In February, Detective Torres was assigned 18 new cases. 10 of these cases were closed in February, 4 were suspended and 4 are carrying over into March. Detective Torres currently has 21 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 172 hours of training, including classes in "Radar Training", "Body Worn Cameras", "Low Light Shooting", "Taser Recertification" and multiple CJIS Security classes.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of February, there were three reported Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) part 1 offenses, compared with four for the month of January and six during the month of February last year. Officers made one arrest during the month for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Officers responded to 23 Traffic Collisions, compared to 31 for January. Our most common collision locations requiring police reports continue to be 3300-3600 Bee Cave Road and 5600 Bee Cave Road.

In February, our officers made 236 traffic stops, issuing 169 citations (71.6%) resulting in 186 violations, and 89 warnings (37.7%). Of the violations that were cited, 110 (59.1%) were for speeding, including 7 citations for Speeding in a School Zone. We also had three citations issued for Failed to Stop for a School Bus. In the 14 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 31 citations and 29 warnings.

During February, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 216 calls for service compared to 260 for January. This resulted in 16 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 202 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 272 for January.
