Public Safety Report November, 2017

Investigations

In November, Detective Torres was assigned 20 new cases. Of these 20 cases, 13 of them were closed or suspended in November and 7 are carrying over into December. Detective Torres currently has 15 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 139 hours of training, including classes in "Texas State and Federal Law Update", "Heartsaver CPR and AED", "NIMS and ICS for Law Enforcement", as well as numerous classes on "IT Security".

Statistical Highlights

During the month of November, there were eight reported NIBRS/Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) part 1 offenses, compared with nine for the month of October and seven during the month of November last year. Officers made seven arrests in November – one for warrants, two for DWI, one for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and three for Public Intoxication.

Officers responded to 35 Traffic Collisions, compared to 47 for October, and this resulted in seven crash reports being created. Our most common collision locations this month requiring a police report were the 3900 block of Bee Cave Road and 701 S. Capital of Texas Hwy, with two collisions each. Of the seven crashes requiring a police report, four of them occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In November, our officers made 289 traffic stops, issuing 134 citations (46.3%) resulting in 150 violations, and 110 warnings (38.0%). Of the violations that were cited, 100 (66.7%) were for speeding. We continued to focus on school zones, and 35 of these 100 speeding violations were for speeding in a school zone. We also issued one citation for using a cell phone in a school zone and one for failure to stop for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 22 violations and 24 warnings.

During November, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 494 calls for service compared to 423 for October. This resulted in 63 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 59 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 180 for October.
