## Public Safety Report October, 2017

### **Investigations**

In October, Detective Torres was assigned 25 new cases. Of these 25 cases, 12 of them were closed or suspended in October and 13 are carrying over into November. Detective Torres currently has 17 open cases that she is investigating.

### **Training**

Officers completed 178 hours of training, including classes in “Planning Public Safety Facilities”, “Field Training Officer”, “Officer Safety”, “Crime Scene Search”, “Arrest, Search and Seizure”, as well as numerous classes on “IT Security”.

### **Statistical Highlights**

During the month of October, there were nine reported NIBRS/Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) part 1 offenses, compared with five for the month of September and eight during the month of October last year. Officers made one arrest for DWI during October.

Officers responded to 47 Traffic Collisions, compared to 23 for September, and this resulted in 13 crash reports being created. Our most common collision location this month requiring a police report was the 5600 block of Bee Cave Road, with four collisions. Of the 13 crashes requiring a police report, 11 of them occurred on Bee Cave Road.

In October, our officers made 283 traffic stops, issuing 147 citations (51.9%) resulting in 158 violations, and 84 warnings (29.6%). Of the violations that were cited, 110 (69.6%) were for speeding. We continued to focus on school zones, and 44 of these 110 speeding violations were for speeding in a school zone. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 32 violations and 21 warnings.

During October, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 423 calls for service compared to 298 for September. This resulted in 54 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 180 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 243 for September.
