Public Safety Report July, 2018

Investigations

In July, Detective Torres was assigned 10 new cases. Of these 10 cases, four were closed or suspended in July – six are carrying over into August. Detective Torres currently has 12 open cases that she is investigating.

Training

Officers completed 45 hours of training, including classes in “Mental Health Officer Certification” and multiple Computer Security Awareness classes.

Statistical Highlights

During the month of July, there were six reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with 12 for the month of June and 13 during the month of July last year. Officers made four in-custody or field release arrests in July – one for Driving with an Invalid License, one for Cruelty to Animals, one for warrants and one for Burglary of a Habitation/ Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon.

Officers responded to 18 Traffic Crashes, compared to 25 for June, and this resulted in eight crash reports being created. Our most common crash location this month requiring a police report was Bee Cave Road, with seven of our eight crashes happening on Bee Cave Road.

In July, our officers made 214 traffic stops, issuing 140 citations (65.4%) resulting in 158 violations, and 128 warnings (59.8%). Of the violations that were cited, 113 (71.5%) were for speeding. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 15 violations and 22 warnings.

During July, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 242 calls for service, compared to 231 calls for service in June. During the month, 48 reports were generated. Officers also conducted 428 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 72 for June.
