## Public Safety Report February, 2018

### **Investigations**

In February, Detective Torres was assigned eight new cases. Of these eight cases, all of them were closed or suspended in February – none are carrying over into March. Detective Torres currently has five open cases that she is investigating.

### **Training**

Officers completed 96 hours of training, including classes in “Roadside Impairment Driving Enforcement” and “Mental Health Officer Certification”, as well as numerous classes on “IT Security”.

### **Statistical Highlights**

During the month of February, there were two reported NIBRS part 1 offenses, compared with seven for the month of January and three during the month of February last year. Officers made six arrests in February - one for a probation violation, one for DWI/possession of Cocaine, one for Theft, one for possession of Marijuana, one for possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and one for Disorderly Conduct.

Officers responded to 18 Traffic Crashes, compared to 26 for January, and this resulted in five crash reports being created. Our most common crash location this month requiring a police report was Bee Cave Road, with all five of our crashes happening in different locations on Bee Cave Road.

In February, our officers made 275 traffic stops, issuing 183 citations (66.5%) resulting in 200 violations, and 135 warnings (49.0%). Of the violations that were cited, 120 (60.0%) were for speeding. We continued to focus on school zones, and 35 of these 120 speeding violations were for speeding in a school zone. We also issued two citations for failure to stop or remain stopped for a school bus. In the 15 targeted enforcement zones, we issued a total of 27 violations and 26 warnings.

During February, West Lake Hills Police Officers responded to 435 calls for service compared to 380 for January. This resulted in 31 reports being generated. Officers also conducted 49 close patrol checks for residents who were out of town, compared to 77 for January.
